Description:

We live in a world which is changeable and open. Nowadays people need a lot of new skills which make their action effective and appropriate.

The main mistake in many interactions is that we believe that communication and understanding took place, whereas in fact it did not...

CICA team prepared workshop whose aim is to Develop and to Improve the intercultural communication skills.

The base of the program is Darla Deardorff's model of intrapersonal contextual conditioning and the intra- as well as interpersonal outputs of this skill.

As students and researchers meet people from many parts of the world, we propose this workshop as a way to improve their international communication skills and make them use these skills more consciously.

The workshop includes:

- The Deardorff model
- Bennett model of acculturation
- The role of leaders, teachers, and tools to work and study in a new environment
- Experiences in being "different" and excises in basic skills

- To see and be more aware of the intercultural gap between "us" and "them",
- To see the potential of cultural diversity,
- To cope with differences and make a step from just "noticing" to "cooperation and goals achieving",
- To prepare procedures to manage problems with cooperation and goal achieving.

MODULE 2

Writing scholarly articles in English – workshop with "Security Dimensions" editor

Time: 14:30–16:00 (1.5 h)

Moderator: Agnieszka Magnuszewska

Description:

Even a great researcher can experience problems when he/she writes a scientific paper to an English-language journal and English is not his/her first language. The purpose of the workshop is to help non-Anglophone scholars in writing effective articles in English.

The theoretical part will include a short presentation on the <u>manuscript writing</u> <u>guidelines</u> created by EASE (European Association of Science Editors). These guidelines are

a great tool for foreign scientists writing in English. Then, some advice will be given on how manuscripts should be prepared before the submission to "Security Dimensions" journal – we will mainly focus on the requirements of international indexing bodies (such as Web of Sciences) that we strive to meet.

In the practical part, participants will perform a couple of practical writing exercises that will help them avoid common writing problems, e.g. problems with creating informative article titles and structured abstracts, or with maintaining good style and cohesion of the article.
